For example, Yaf_3 does not really mean the area of the parallelogram determined by the vectors o and f_3 , but is a mode of representing that area by a vector line perpendicular to its plane. The method requires indeed a succession of definitions, and a careful geometrical discussion of the properties of the quantities so defined.
